The drum takes center stage in this collaboration among three rhythmically-complex music traditions. Each of the musicians is a master in his genre--

Kenny Endo in taiko, **Abhijit Banerjee** on tabla, and **John Santos** on Latin percussion. Each is an experienced composer, and they share a passion for exploring musical collaborations across genres and cultural backgrounds.

With *Uncommon Time*, the chance drum exchange has evolved into a witty and heartfelt musical dialogue among cultures, as these three musicians, experienced in cultural exchange, create new compositions using the rich palette of percussion forms, rhythmic interchange, and an array of instrumentation.

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Kenny Endo: "There are great drumming traditions from all over the world and this work brings together Afro-Caribbean, Indian, and Japanese musical cultures. It is rare for drummers to be featured and to step out of the role of being accompaniment to theater, dance, and other instruments. We hope our music will resonate and give hope to appreciating differences around the world and at the same time show the potential for working together to create."

The performance consists of the three artists playing as a group, to create a full-evening show of new works. Unlike other percussion collaborations and rhythm exchanges, this project creates completely integrated works that draw from roots in three distinctly different drum styles, sounds, and rhythms but with a synthesis that embraces them all.

The work premiered in Hawai'i at Leeward Community College in January 2012.

Each of the artists is experienced at teaching and giving workshops; the tour will include the opportunity for education services, such as lecture-demonstrations, workshops, and master classes by the artists.

One of the leading personas in contemporary percussion and rhythm, **Kenny Endo** is at the vanguard of the taiko genre, continuing to pave new paths in this Japanese style of drumming. A performer, composer, and teacher of taiko, he has received numerous awards and accolades. He was the first foreigner to be honored with a "natori," stage name, in Japanese classical drumming. Kenny Endo is a consummate artist, blending Japanese taiko with rhythms influenced from his jazz background and collaborations around the world into original melodies and improvisation.
